Purpose of the District




Fire District Governing Authority

The American Canyon Fire Protection District was established on January 31, 1955 by Napa County Board of Supervisors on November 6, 1957. In 1992, the City was incorporated. At incorporation, the American Canyon Fire Protection District was preserved as a subsidiary special District of the City with the elected City Council members serving as the "exofficio" Board of Directors for the District.






EMERGENCY INCIDENTS

AC FIRE DISTRICT RESPONDED TO 2.190 TOTAL INCIDENTS

- Rescues and Emergency Services 1,475 at 67%
- Good Intent Calls 326 at 15%
- Service Calls 142 at 6%
- False Alarms and False Calls 139 at 6%
- Fires 73 at 3%
- Hazardous Conditions 34 at 2%









EMERGENCY INCIDENTS

Last year, 14.34% of emergency incidents involved multiple simultaneous calls, meaning that at least two calls were occurring at the same time. The accompanying graph illustrates the number of concurrent calls throughout the year.

TRAINING HIGHLIGHTS

The American Canyon Fire Protection District is committed to excellence in training, ensuring our firefighters meet and exceed local and state mandates. In 2024, our 22 suppression firefighters dedicated a total of 16,598 hours to comprehensive training, enhancing their skills and readiness to serve the community effectively.

Key Training Areas:

- Auto Extrication Mastering vehicle rescue techniques for swift and safe victim extrication.
- Live Fire Training Simulating real-world fire scenarios to refine firefighting tactics.
- Advanced Emergency Medical Skills Enhancing lifesaving interventions and patient care.
- Hazardous Materials (HazMat) Strengthening response capabilities for hazardous incidents.
- Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) Training in disaster response, structural collapse, and technical rescues
- Childbirth Emergencies Preparing firefighters to assist in emergency childbirth situations.
- Probationary Training Developing new firefighters with essential skills and knowledge.
- Policy Updates Keeping personnel informed on the latest operational procedures.
- Emergency Vehicle Operations Ensuring safe and efficient response driving practices.






PREVENTION 2024

FIRE PREVENTION

The Fire Prevention Division consists of the Fire Chief, Fire Company Inspectors, and CSG Consultants. The District entered into contract with CSG Consultants in September 2019. CSG offers experienced CSFM / ICC certified inspectors. The Fire Chief is the Fire Marshal and is responsible for code enforcement, review and engineering of fire plans, fire investigations, and fire and life safety education.
