Purpose of the District

- ▣ To combat fire and conflagration on public and private property, to take actions to prevent fire, to provide emergency medical service, paramedical service, technical rescue service, and any other service required in an emergency, consistent with the governing fire protection district law, The Fire Protection Law of 1987, Health and Safety Code Section 1800 *et seq.*, the “Act”



Fire District Governing Authority

The American Canyon Fire Protection District was established on January 31, 1955 by Napa County Board of Supervisors on November 6, 1957. In 1992, the City was incorporated. At incorporation, the American Canyon Fire Protection District was preserved as a subsidiary special District of the City with the elected City Council members serving as the “ex-officio” Board of Directors for the District.

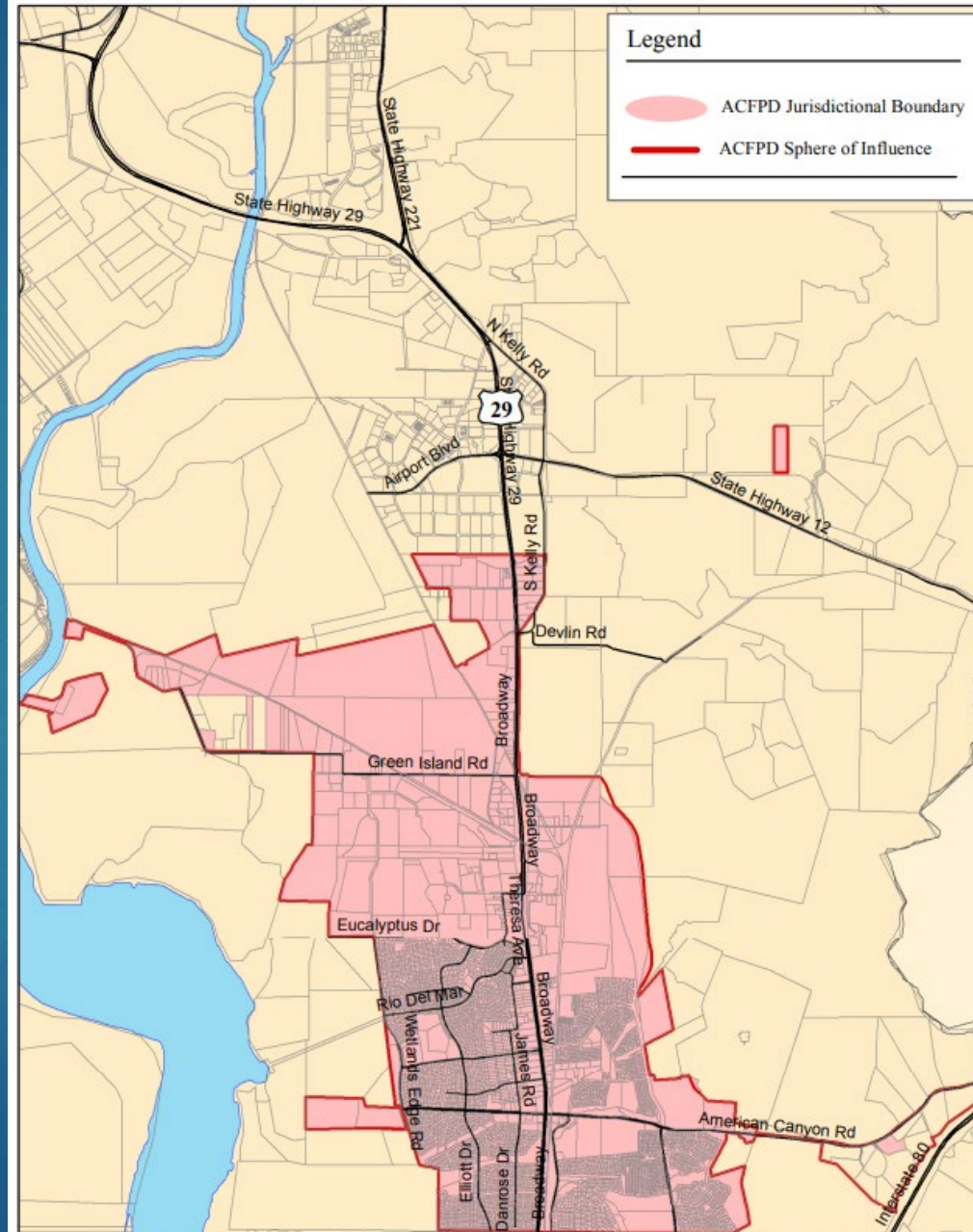

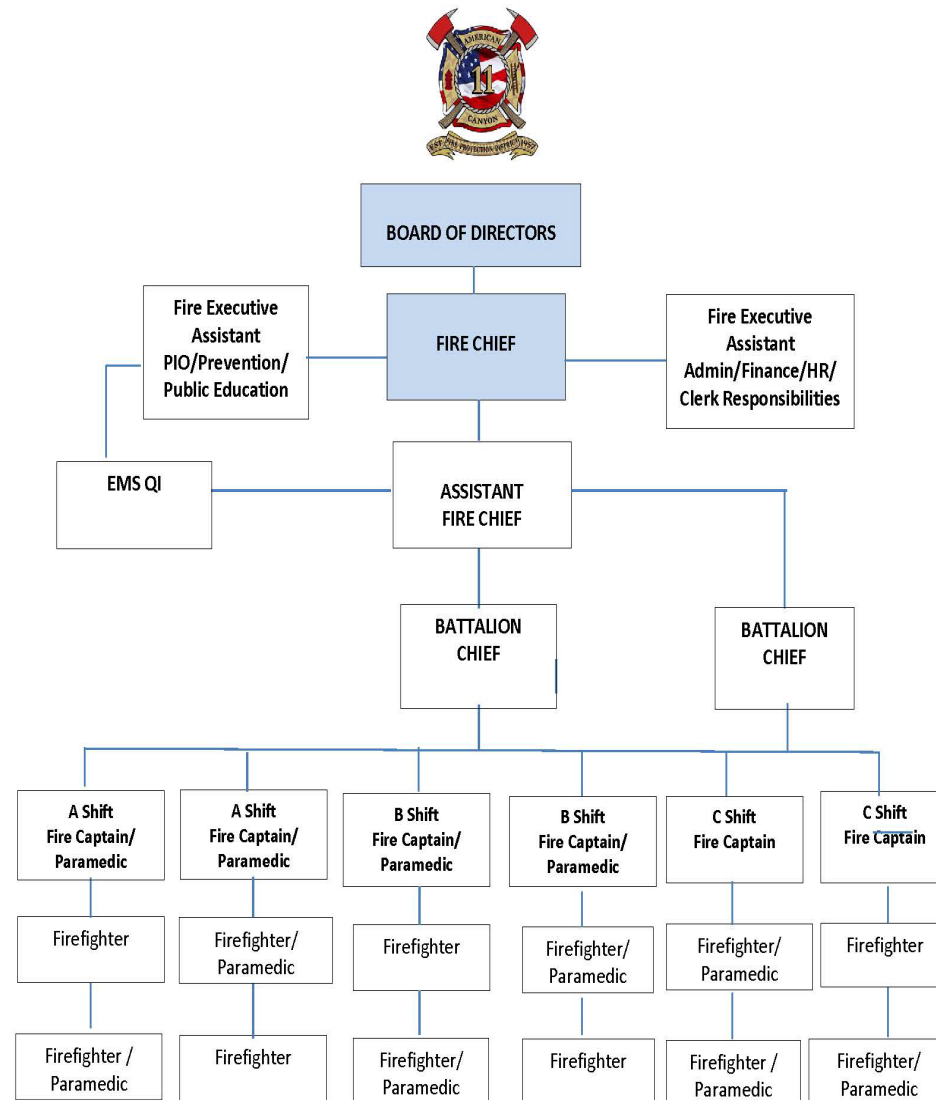

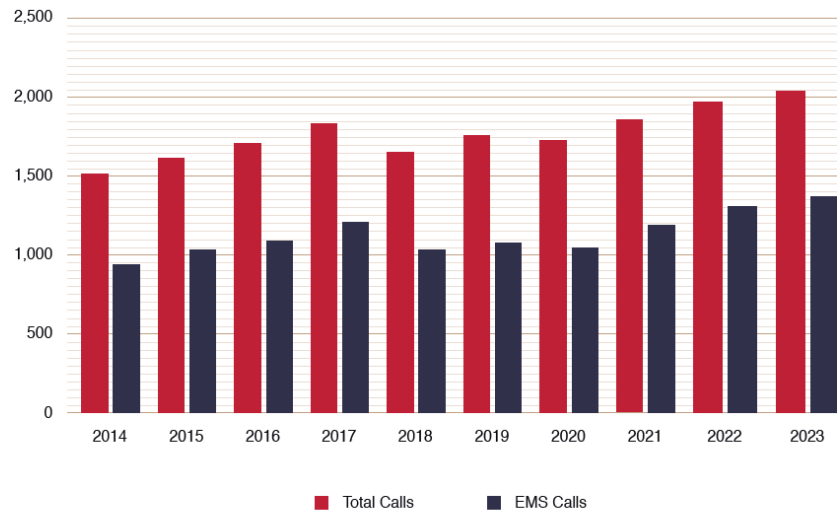

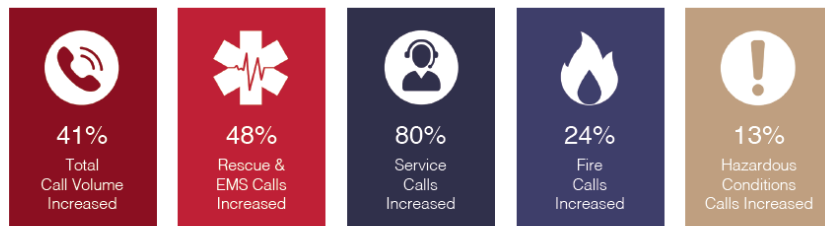

10-YEAR HISTORY OF EMS CALLS IN RELATION TO TOTAL CALL VOLUME

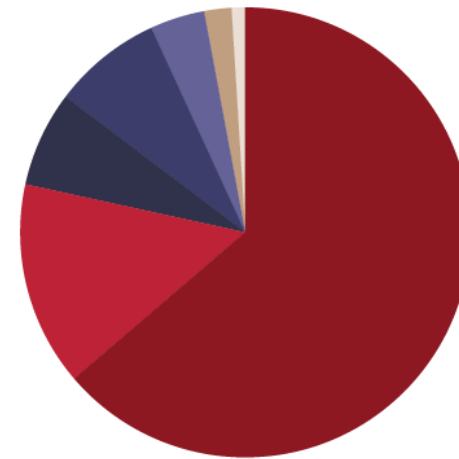


OVER THE LAST 10 YEARS...

CALLS FOR SERVICE BY AREA



AC FIRE DISTRICT RESPONDED TO 2,139 TOTAL INCIDENTS

- Rescues and Emergency Services — 1,394 at 65%
- Good Intent Calls — 324 at 15%
- Service Calls — 180 at 8%
- False Alarms and False Calls — 114 at 5%
- Fires — 82 at 4%
- Hazardous Conditions — 44 at 2%
- Severe Weather or Natural Disaster — 1 at 0%

In 2023 our call volume increased by 31% while our budget only increased 4.4%

FIRE PREVENTION

The Fire Prevention Division consists of the Fire Chief, Fire Company Inspectors, and CSO Consultants. The District entered into contract with CSO Consultants in September 2019. CSO offers experienced CSRM / ICC certified inspectors. The Fire Chief is the Fire Marshal and is responsible for code enforcement, review and engineering of fire plans, fire investigations, and fire and life safety education.
